Pray for Dead

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

# Praying for the dead is a Spiritual Work of Mercy

In biblical tradition, the first time prayer was offered for the dead is found in Maccabees 12:39-45). In this reference, Maccabee, a Jewish leader in 163 BCE asked his troops to pray that God would forgive the sins of their comrades. This is the first indication in the Bible of a belief that prayers offered by the living can help free the dead from any sin that would separate them from God in the life tome. In the New Testament, Paul also offers a prayer for a man who died, "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day..." (2Tim 1:18). The practice of praying for the dead is rooted first in Christian belief in the everlasting life promised in Jesus' teachings and foreshadowed by his disciples' experience that God had raised him from the dead. After death, even though separated from our earthly body, we yet continue a personal existence. Praying for the dead is one of seven spiritual works of mercy that we can engage in during the month of November.
